



### **Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

After spending most of His ministry in Capernaum and along the Sea of Galilee, Jesus returns to His hometown of Nazareth. This was a small community and a place where Jesus would have been well known but people's familiarity with Jesus doesn't lead to faith. They reject Him and are offended by Him. As Jesus teaches in the Synagogue, the people of Nazareth are astonished. They are astonished, because His teaching with wisdom and authority seems inconsistent with who they have known Him to be a man of ordinary occupation and from a ordinary family. Their astonishment didn't lead to faith but to offense. Many people are just like the people of Nazareth. They hear of Jesus but don't accept who He says He is.

Jesus replied to them by quoting a well-known proverb that affirms that prophets are often rejected in their own town and by their own people. Because of their unbelief could do no mighty works. This does not mean that Jesus was incapable. But Jesus chooses to respond to those who come to Him in faith. It is astonishing to consider that a people could know Him so well, and be so familiar with Him, and yet not believe. Jesus has come and has revealed Himself as God and as the Saviour of all who believe. Yet while some respond in faith, others find Jesus and His Gospel offensive. While some are very familiar with Jesus or think they know who He is, they still cannot see Him as the One they need. We must be faithful in looking to the Scriptures and learning to follow and proclaim the true Christ. The unbelief of the people of Nazareneth should be a reminder to us to know Jesus rightly and trust Him fully.
