Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

God created Adam and Eve in Paradise and told them they could eat the fruit of the Tree of Life. But they ate from the Tree of Knowledge. Therefore, they were cast out of Paradise. Our entry into the church through Baptism is our re-entry into Paradise. The Church is the foretaste of the heavenly paradise. Here, Jesus represents the tree of life. The fruit of the tree of life is the Eucharist. Jesus gives his own body and blood in the form of bread and wine for our nourishment. When we receive the Eucharist, we are united with Jesus Christ. As we are united with Jesus, we also share His life which is eternal. Our holiness and eternity are taking part in the holiness and eternity of Jesus. The more we are united with Christ, the more we share His holiness. It demands our worthiness to receive the Eucharist. So, Eucharist is the medicine for our eternal life. Jesus made this medicine available and possible for all. We can say that Jesus has come to this world to become Eucharist through which He makes us united with Him.

In the parable of the prodigal son, when he comes back to his father after his repentance, his father accepts his as his own son and prepares a banquet for him. In the same way, when we come back to the house of God, which is the Church, God prepares a banquet for us. This banquet is the Holy Mass. Here, Jesus gives His own body and blood as our meal for our nourishment. So, the Eucharistic celebration is the banquet that God prepares for us. God expects that we all should participate in the banquet in a worthy manner. Whenever we miss Holy Mass, we miss the banquet that God prepares for us. The Eucharist is the precious gift of God for His children to become Christ like.
