Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

What keeps us interested in this Sunday's Gospel is that there is a sense of expectation. Advent is a season of expectation. It is the beginning of the church year and the name Advent means "Coming". It is the four-week period right before Christmas in which we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus Christ into the world. As we have been made responsible for God's world to heal the harm of sin and evil, let us stay Fr. Jibu Mathew awake working with love and prepare for Christ's second coming.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY (SVP)

The St. Vincent de Paul Society is an international Christian voluntary organization dedicated to tackling poverty and disadvantage by providing practical assistance to people in need irrespective of ideology, faith, ethnicity, age or gender.

The Society is a lay organization initially formed in Paris in 1833 by Blessed Frederic Ozanam and his companions, and active in England and Wales since 1844. Placed under the Patronage of St. Vincent de Paul, it is inspired by his thinking and works. It seeks, in the spirit of justice and charity, to help those who are suffering the effects of poverty in whatever form. Works include visiting the lonely, soup runs, foodbanks, furniture shops and charity shops in areas of deprivation, visiting the sick, giving grants to those in need, debt counselling, and assisting refugees and asylum seekers.
