

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today is the second Sunday of Advent. Advent is a hopeful season. Hope is an important virtue, deeper than simple optimism. We can feel optimistic about all kinds of things, but strictly speaking, the true object of hope is union with God. We are hopeful God can bring life out of death, light out of darkness. During Advent we are meant, like the Baptist, to prepare the way for Jesus as our Saviour. We need to see what in our lives needs straightening out. Filling valleys, levelling mountains, straightening the crooked road, preparing a pathway for the Lord. All this is our preparation for Christmas. Of course, it involves decisions, and these decisions from the realities of my life. God is always calling for a response. Responding to Him is to become responsible. when he finishes his preaching, what John will tell us, which is true, that if you prepare your hearts, you straighten the pathways and make it an easy road and ride for God Himself to embrace your heart, then you will have found the Messiah.

The other thing that this preparation for Christmas calls upon us to do is to remember that Christmas is a gift that is primarily the gift of God. For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. (Jn 3:16) It is the gift of God of His Only Begotten Son, a gift given to us and, in our turn, we are to give this gift, the gift that God has given us, to each other and to all the people in our area of peace, hope and love. This is why Christmas is a time for gift giving and we imitate God Himself.
