



My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's Gospel, Jesus was straightforward in his words when he said: "Unless you repent, you will perish." One might say that this is too harsh to come from Christ, who is merciful and compassionate. The truth is that when Jesus speaks this way, it does not diminish his compassion and mercy. Instead, he does so because he cares for us and sees what we cannot see. He simply warns us of the negative consequences of living a sinful life and wants us to repent and live a better life. The Good News is that we can learn from the failures and consequences of our ancestor's actions. God gives us another chance to call upon the Lord, who is "merciful, compassionate and love." Jesus wants us to take a bold and positive step towards amending our way of life. This is a call to repentance for the times we neglected and failed both God and our neighbours; for the times we chose evil over good, and for those moments, we despaired and displayed a remarkable lack of faith in God. The patient, compassionate and loving Father is ready to welcome us back. Hence, he says to us this season: "If my people, called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then...I will forgive their sin and will heal their land" (2 Ch 7, 14). Repentance attracts mercy, compassion, forgiveness, and salvation. It brings about healing and restoration of hope for a better future. So, if we sincerely repent of our sins, God will not only forgive us, but He will heal us. God's compassion and mercy for us are always associated with his love. Through our repentance, His compassion, mercy, and love, we would be healed and restored to life this season and beyond.


