Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our liturgy today invites each of us to acknowledge and deepen our participation in the Trinitarian communion of Father, Son and Spirit. The Trinity is the defining doctrine of our faith as Christians. We are baptized "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Mt 28:19). We begin our formal and informal prayers with this Trinitarian formula. The great Eucharistic prayers of the Mass end with the beautiful Trinitarian prayer: 'Through him (Jesus), with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is Yours, Almighty Father, forever and ever'. The Trinity is not just a dogma of our faith, or a formula to be recited in our liturgy, but the heart of our Christian way of life. The doctrine of the Trinity is as much about us as it is about God. It is about how God relates with us and how we are called and challenged to relate to one another. It is about what it means to be persons created in the image of the One who is Love. Hence the Trinity is profoundly relevant to our everyday lives. To be human means to be like the God who created us; the God in whom we live and move and have our being; the God who chose to make his home among us through his Son; the God who lives within us through his Spirit. To become like this God of love means to live in relationships of love and respect, nor only with our fellow humans, but with all God's creatures - all with whom we share the gift of life. In other words, we are called to participate fully in the Trinitarian communion of Father, Son and Spirit through our loving communion with one another and with all creation. Mindful that God loves us so much He cannot take His eyes off us.
