## **Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

Jesus and the Letter to the Hebrews remind us that the path to God is narrow, demanding, and full of lessons. Pursuing it, not all endure—some slip, some grow distracted, others turn back. This is the image Jesus gives when He speaks of the narrow door to salvation. In life, every achievement, whether in sports, business, or the spiritual life, requires effort, sacrifice, and perseverance. Success is never "easy-peasy." The path is challenging, often discouraging, and yet it forms strength. Salvation is much the same: it is not automatic, inherited, or gained by simply being near the right people. It demands commitment and endurance.

The Letter to the Hebrews teaches: "The Lord trains those He loves." Just as parents guide and correct their children out of love, so God disciplines us. Left unguided, we could wander into ruin. A study once showed that 76% of young offenders had an absent father—an image of what happens when guidance is missing. God does not abandon us; He trains us so that we may bear fruit in peace and goodness. Consider athletes, entrepreneurs, or spiritual leaders. All endured repeated failures, sacrifices, and discipline before reaching their goals. Think of a marathon runner: early mornings, aching muscles, mental strain. Yet each moment of pain builds endurance and resilience. Their triumph comes not because the path was easy, but because it was tested.

Our spiritual life works the same way. God's discipline strengthens faith, tempers character, and prepares us to pass through the narrow door into eternal life. Growth is gradual: Rome was built brick by brick; we reach milestones one step at a time. So too with God: our journey is built prayer by prayer, act by act, moment by moment. Begin where you are. Capture inspiration when it comes. In these small, faithful steps, we discover that the narrow door leads to the fullness of life with God.

## **CARD PAYMENTS**

We are pleased to announce that like many other Churches in the Diocese, we are now able to take offerings and second collection donations by card payment.

We have installed a 'Dona' card reader machine, which can be found at the back of the Church, it's very straightforward to use, you just need to follow the on-screen instructions.

If you wish to Gift Aid your donations, the first time you use the card reader, you will be asked for your full name, email address and postcode. The reader is linked to software that retains your Gift Aid information, so you will only need to enter this information the first time you use your payment card.

The card reader is fully secure and none of your personal details are held on the reader itself. It works just like using your card in a shop.

As normal we will also continue to collect offerings by Cash collection and Standing Order. We hope that the introduction of the card reader will provide an alternative method of donating for those who prefer to use it.
