Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In Luke 12:13–21, Jesus tells the parable of the Rich Fool, a man who believed his wealth could guarantee security, comfort, and joy. Blessed with a plentiful harvest, he resolved to tear down his barns and build bigger ones to store all his grain. His plan? To retire early and "eat, drink, and be merry." But God called him a fool. Why? Because that very night, his life was demanded of him. All his careful plans, all his wealth - none of it could follow him into eternity. The man was rich in possessions, but **poor toward God**.

Jesus used this parable to warn us about the danger of avarice, the greedy desire for more. He reminds us: "Life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." We are not defined by what we own, but by who we are before God. To be rich toward God means investing in eternal things: generosity, compassion, humility, and faith. It means trusting not in our bank accounts but in God's grace. It means seeking His kingdom first, knowing that everything else will be added in His time.

This parable is not about a man long ago. It's about us today. We are all storing up treasures somewhere. The question is: Are we storing up treasures in heaven? Let us examine our hearts. Do we cling to things, or to Christ? Will we be ready when our time comes? Jesus gave up the riches of heaven to make us spiritually rich through His poverty on the cross. Choose Him, and you gain everything. "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:21)
