Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday's readings invite us to reflect on how we live as stewards of the many blessings God has placed in our hands. In the first reading, the prophet Amos raises his voice against those who exploit the poor and manipulate the vulnerable for profit. His words remind us that God sees every act of injustice and hears the cry of those who are oppressed. As Christians, we are called to live differently—to act with fairness, compassion, and integrity in our daily dealings.

The responsorial psalm tells us: "Blessed the one who is gracious and lends to those in need." True righteousness is not measured by possessions or power, but by generosity, mercy, and concern for the weak. To be blessed is to reflect God's heart in our relationships and choices.

In the second reading, St. Paul urges us to pray for all people, especially those who hold authority. Prayer is not only about our personal needs, but also about lifting up society and its leaders, that peace, justice, and dignity may flourish. Prayer keeps us centered on God, the true source of wisdom and strength.

Finally, in the Gospel, Jesus presents the parable of the dishonest steward. While the steward acted unjustly, his foresight and decisiveness are commended. Jesus challenges us: if people work so shrewdly for worldly gain, should not the children of light act wisely and purposefully for eternal life? We cannot serve both God and wealth. Money, talents, and influence are not ends in themselves, but tools for serving God and neighbor. Let us then use what we have—our time, gifts, and resources—to build God's kingdom, care for those in need, and prepare for eternal joy.
