Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel offers us two powerful images of discipleship. First, Jesus compares it to building a tower. Imagine an architect spreading out the blueprint, pencil in hand, carefully counting the cost—are there enough bricks, enough workers, enough energy to finish? Nobody wants to begin only to stop halfway through. Then, Jesus compares discipleship to a king preparing for battle. The king considers his soldiers, weighs the risks, and even negotiates peace if necessary. Both examples remind us that following Christ requires reflection, courage, and readiness.

Discipleship is not accidental or casual. It is a lifelong adventure with unexpected turns, moments of joy, and times of challenge. Some days feel like climbing a mountain barefoot, while others are smooth and easy. Yet every step, every moment of perseverance, brings us closer to the Kingdom. To follow Christ means staying flexible, resilient, and trusting that the One who guides us will see us through.

Our first reading, from the Book of Wisdom, is a humbling and uplifting reminder of our place before God. We struggle even to understand the realities of this world—how a bird takes flight, how a seed becomes a flower—let alone the mysteries of heaven. Yet creation itself is filled with little "windows" into God's wisdom, creativity, and love. Each sunrise, each living creature, each detail of life reflects His care. And in the middle of this vast and intricate creation, the Psalmist's question comes alive: "What is man that you care for him?" Yet God does care, deeply and personally. God's wisdom far surpasses ours; trusting Him brings peace even in uncertainty. Our knowledge is small and fragile, yet His insight is like the sun—limitless and steady. To see His greatness is also to see our dignity: small, fragile, yet infinitely loved.

CSSA Thematic Inspection of Survivor Engagement

The Catholic Safeguarding Standards Agency (CSSA) are undertaking a thematic inspection of survivor engagement and support, and the Archdiocese of Birmingham has been chosen as one of the Dioceses to be involved in this project. As such, all Dioceses and Religious Life Groups (RLGs) have been asked by the CSSA to share a public survey inviting survivors to contribute their experiences. The purpose of this public call is to gather information from anyone who has had recent contact with the Archdiocese of Birmingham, or any other Diocese or RLG. This includes experiences that are new or ongoing, as well as those connected to non-recent abuse, both in a faith context and outside of faith. While the primary focus is the period from July 2024 onwards, the CSSA do not wish to limit what survivors choose to share.
